Motorcycle Accidents


Many motorcyclists enjoy the freedom that comes from riding on the open road. However, this freedom comes with a number of risks, and motorcyclists are constantly aware that they could be seriously injured or killed because of the negligence of other drivers. Collisions between motorcycles and cars or trucks often result in devastating injuries and death. In these cases, it is crucial that the injured person or the estate of the deceased retain a **personal injury** attorney who knows how to properly investigate and prosecute these unique types of crashes.

There are multiple ways that drivers can act negligently and cause collisions that injure motorcyclists. Since motorcycles are smaller than other vehicles, a driver may fail to realize that a motorcycle is in their blind spot. This can lead to a collision when a driver changes lanes or makes a turn. Devastating motorcycle crashes often occur when a driver makes a left turn in front of a motorcycle or fails to respect a motorcyclist's right-of-way.


Many motorcyclists suffer head trauma and **traumatic brain injuries** in spite of wearing a helmet because the forces involved in the collision tend to be directly transmitted into their bodies. This is why motorcyclists are far more likely to suffer serious fractures, extreme "road rash", and scarring and disfigurement, as well as spinal cord injuries and **wrongful death**.
